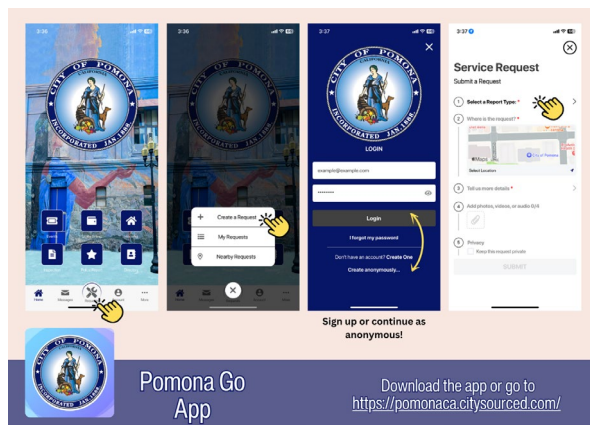

PUBLIC WORKS

CANYON WAY AND MCKINLEY AVE NEW TRAFFIC SIGNAL

The Canyon Way and McKinley Avenue traffic signal improvements are complete! We appreciate the community's patience and are excited to improve the traffic control at this intersection. The new traffic signal will now allow left turns from Canyon Way to McKinley Avenue, provide a crosswalk across McKinley Avenue, and improve lighting at this intersection. Streetlights were also installed in the turnout area along McKinley Avenue to help improve visibility at night. The traffic signal will also assist with traffic control during large events held at the Fairplex. This project was the highest priority for the Fairplex Mitigation Fund Advisory Committee and was funded through the Fairplex Mitigation Fund.



THANK YOU, POMONA, FOR RECYCLING YOUR ORGANICS!

Did you know that SB 1383, California's statewide food waste reduction and recovery law, requires cities to purchase and distribute compost and mulch? These organic materials – compost made from recycled food and green waste, and mulch made from landscaping debris and wood products – benefit both the environment and local economy.

Thanks to your efforts in separating organic waste, the City of Pomona can put those materials to good use. Over the last month, the City's Parks and Facilities Division applied recycled mulch at Ganesha Park, covering slopes, planters, and parkways. The mulching project was expanded to Casa Primera landscaping on the corner of N. Park and W. McKinley Avenues.

This mulch was created from yard waste and landscaping debris you've helped recycle through the City's partnership with Athens Services. Your participation not only helps us meet SB 1383 requirements, but it also allows us to reinvest in our community and keep our parks healthy and beautiful!

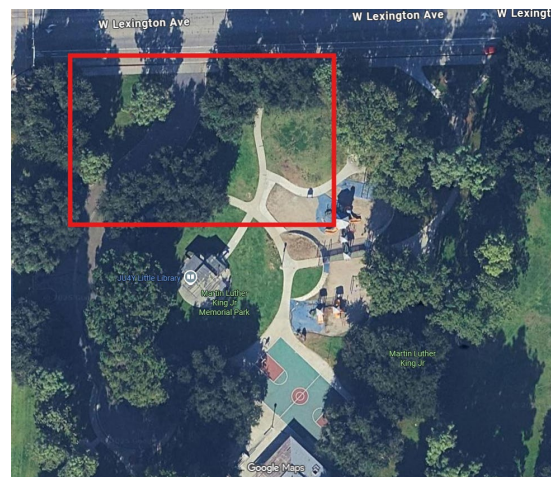
MORE PARK IMPROVEMENTS UNDERWAY! PARK RESTROOM TO BE INSTALLED AT MARTIN LUTHER KING, JR. PARK

Martin Luther King, Jr. Park is getting new restrooms! This project is funded with American Rescue Plan funds and CIP Project fund reserves. Construction for the new restrooms has begun and is anticipated to be completed by Spring 2026.

A portion of Martin Luther King, Jr. Park will be closed tentatively on Tuesday, October 21st, while we crane in the new prefabricated restroom building. Please see below for the park closure area; access to the parking lot will be prohibited. We apologize for the inconvenience and thank you for your patience as we work to improve our parks. Once restroom renovations are complete, the improvements will be well worth the wait and will enhance the overall experience for everyone!

The MLK Park restroom project will include a newly constructed restroom at a different site within the park. The new location will work better for our park goers. As MLK park goers are aware, the former park restrooms are being removed as part of the skate park expansion phase of the MLK Improvement Project. There will be no restroom facilities available at the park during this time.
