PUBLIC HEARING:

1. Major Certificate of Appropriateness (MAJCOA 000360-2025) for 1515 Ganesha Place

Associate Planner Fortune presented the item.

- 1. Request to legalize 24 unpermitted vinyl windows on a primary structure of a contributing resource in the Hacienda Heights historic district.
- 2. Code Compliance issued a notice of violation
- 3. Windows replaced in 2014 by the previous homeowner
- 4. Vinyl is an incompatible material
- 5. Staff recommends denying the Major Certificate of Appropriateness
- 6. If Commission approves the request the project will be categorial exempt from CEQA

Planning Manager Starns stated that the Commission's findings must be the same under CEQA. He stated the previous owner replaced the windows without permission from the city.

Planning Manager Starns recommended to the Commission to continue the item for staff to discuss the Mills Act program with the homeowner.

- 5. The Commission discussed the option to continue the item to allow the homeowner the opportunity to apply for a Mills Act

1. Determination of Historic Significance (DHS-000418-2025) for 1150 Fairplex Drive (John F. Kennedy Park)

Associate Planner Alan Fortune presented the item.

1. Provided an extensive history of the site to the Commission to determine the historical significance of the property.

2. Determination of Historic Significance (DHS-000417-2025) for 450 W. Grand Avenue (Tony Cerda Park)

Associate Planner Fortune presented the item.

- 1. Provided an extensive history of the site to the Commission to determine the historical significance of the property.
- 2. Staff recommends that the restroom facility within Tony Cerda Park is not historic.

Commission concerns/questions

1. Commissioner Alvarez asked if the architects constructed other structures in the city. She also asked if the restroom was built due to the demonstrations in the 1970s.

- 2. Commissioner Swodeck said that the architects also built the school of music in West Covina.
- 3. Commissioner Swodeck had concerns about the restroom contributing to the Pow Wows (cultural celebration).

Planning Manager Starns said that if the restroom was built before 1970 staff's recommendation would have been different. He stated that Tony Cerda Park as a whole is historic. He mentioned that we have not found anything in the context statement that would identify these architects being significant in our history. He said the restroom was not in response to the demonstrations. He stated that Public Works will replace the public restroom. He mentioned that to designate a structure histoirc it must meet one of the following criteria: architecture of the building, the people associated with the building and the events that happen.

Director Donavanik stated that the restroom did not contribute to the Pow Wows.

Moved by Chairperson Keller, seconded by Commissioner Anten, to determine not historic. Motion carried (5-0-0-2)
