

# Bookie Suspect Arrested in Raid

Pomona and Los Angeles county sheriff's vice squad officers swooped down on a home at 835 N. Myrtle avenue yesterday at 1:10 p. m. to arrest George Spence, 55, on a bookmaking charge, Chief of Police Ralph Parker said today.

Parker said investigators received several bets over the phone while on the raid and that Spence's scratch sheets, betting markers and other bookie paraphenalia was seized for evidence. Spence was arrested under the terms of the state code in violation of Sec. 330A and the chief said the man apparently relayed

bets to points in San Bernardino county thru his phone. A complaint and warrant was

issued against Spence and he will have a preliminary hearing on the charge at 10 a.m. November 21, Parker said.

## Bookie Suspect Held for Trial

George Spence, 835 N. Myrtle, will be arraigned in superior court at 9:30 a. m. December 19 on a charge of bookmaking, Judge Roland J. Brownsberger ruled today in San Jose court, holding Spence in superior court after a preliminary hearing.

Spence was arrested November 16 in a surprise raid by Pomona police who confiscated betting markers, scratch sheets and three telephones. The judge ruled that Spence's \$1000 bond would remain in effect pending the superior court arraignment.

In other San Jose court actions today, Judge Brownsberger granted a continuance to 10 a. m. December 12 for the preliminary hearing of four Pomona youths accused of the November 13 dynamiting of the Pomona Ramblers Motorcycle clubhouse at the airport on S. Garey avenue.

The four youths were identified as Herbert Zieman, 31; G. E. Cooke, 20; Charles P. Newell, 20, and Robert Brown, 20. All are free on \$150 bail pending arraignment.
