The City of Pomona is committed to preventing flooding and protecting properties by remaining proactive in emergency preparedness efforts.

To support residents in preparing for potential heavy rain or flooding, Public Works has recently added a "Free Self-Service Sandbag Filling Station" at Washington Park, while supplies last. Please be respectful of your community, and only take what is needed for your home in Pomona – up to 20 bags.
