CULTURAL ARTS COMMISSION – AD-HOC COMMITTEE APPLICATIONS

The Cultural Arts Commission is currently accepting application for its Ad-Hoc Advisory Committee! Deadline to apply is July 7, 2025.

What is the Ad-Hoc Advisory Committee? This committee plays an essential role

in shaping public art in our city. Responsibilities include:

- Reviewing and approving Conceptual Design Plan application for public art proposed on private property by a private applicant.
- Reviewing and recommending Original Artwork Murals to the Commission.
- Reviewing and recommending Calls for Artists, to the Commission, as needed.

Who is Eligible? The Ad-hoc Advisory Committee shall consist of four community members with at least five years of experience as artists or arts professionals.

<u>To be eligible</u>, applicants must meet one of the following eligibility requirements:

- Reside in the City
- Own a business in the City
- Serve on the Board or work for a non-profit Organization based in the City

How are Members Selected?

Committee members are appointed by the **Cultural Arts Commission** for a 12-month term. If a vacancy occurs before the term ends, a replacement will be selected from the current year's application pool.

GAREY UNDERPASS MURAL

The installation of a new mural under the Garey Avenue underpass has begun and is expected to be completed by end of June 2025. To accommodate the project, full-time closures of **the outside lane** will be place for approximately seven weeks in each directionfirst for northbound followed traffic.





southbound traffic. Please note that at least one lane will always remain open in each direction to maintain traffic flow.

The east wall (north-bound side) is nearly complete. The west wall (south-bound side) began June 6!

INFORMATION TECHNOLOGY

CLOUD COLLABORATION SUITE

As part of IT's ongoing efforts to modernize our technology infrastructure, we successfully migrated City Hall staff to a cloud-based collaboration suite designed to enhance productivity and cross-department teamwork. The implementation is now

underway with Police Deportment staff, with careful planning to ensure minimal disruption during the transition. This initiative will also strengthen the City's cybersecurity posture through the adoption of multifactor authentication and the strategic use of secure, cloud-based technologies.

NETWORK HARDENING

To help protect our systems and data, IT recently updated the City's firewall to automatically block known malicious IP addresses. The update results in less manual maintenance and administration of blacklisting IPs and stops potential cyber threats before they reach us. FOOTHILL GOLD LINE-POMONA NORTH DEDICATION CEREMONY

STREET SWEEPING SIGNS

Our dedicated Public Services team has been hard at work preparing the brand new street sweeping signs throughout your neighborhood. These updated signs clearly display the new sweeping schedule, including the specific day and time your street will be cleaned.

This update is designed to help everyone know exactly when to move vehicles off the street—making it easier to avoid citations and keep our streets clean. Please note: **the new sweeping schedule goes into effect on July 1, 2025.**

We understand that changes like this can take some getting used to, and we're committed to keeping our community informed every step of the way.

Here's what you can expect **in June** as we prepare for the new street sweeping schedule:

- **Unveiling of New Signs**: Crews will be removing the bags covering the new street sweeping signs. These signs display the updated schedule, clearly indicating when to move your vehicle off the street starting **July 1, 2025**.
- **Follow the Current Schedule for Now:** Until the new schedule takes effect, residents and business owners should continue to follow the City's existing street sweeping routes and times.

Starting **July 1**, **2025**, the City will roll out important changes to our street sweeping program:

- **New "Split System" in Effect:** The updated schedule introduces a *split system*, meaning each side of the street may now be swept on different days. For example, one side might be swept on the **first Monday** of the month, while the other side is swept on the **second Monday**. Be sure to check the new signs on your street for specific days and times.
- **Grace Period for Enforcement:** We understand change takes time. That's why **July will serve as a warning period**. Our goal is to help everyone adjust. During this time, enforcement officers will issue **warnings** to vehicles parked during posted sweeping times. **Citations will begin later**, once the community has had time to adapt.

We encourage all residents and business owners to keep an eye out for the newly-installed street sweeping signs in your area. These signs display the updated sweeping schedule to help ensure you're parking legally and avoiding tickets. To stay informed, please review the new schedule and visit the <u>City website</u> regularly for the latest updates on the street sweeping program.

CLOSURES DUE TO ROUNDABOUTS CONSTRUCTION

The City is excited to announce that construction is now 50% complete on its first three roundabouts, a key component of the Pomona Multi-Neighborhood Pedestrian and Bicycle Improvements Project. This transformative effort is largely funded by a \$10 million Active Transportation Program (ATP) Cycle 4 grant, awarded to the City in 2019. Additional funding comes from County Measures R and M, Proposition C, and Gas Tax revenues, bringing the total investment to \$18.8 million.

This Citywide project includes various pedestrian and bicycle enhancements across multiple neighborhoods, aimed at improving safety, connectivity, and mobility for all road users. Work began in March 2024 and will continue through summer 2025, with full project completion anticipated by fall 2025.

Roundabouts are being constructed at the following locations, and are expected to provide both calming of traffic as well as a more convenient way to travel through these intersections without traffic signals:

- S. Hamilton Blvd. and W 9th St.
 - o **Street closure** for Hamilton Blvd. are between 7th St. to 11th St. (N-S), and closures for 9th St. are between Buena Vista Ave. to White Ave. (E-W)
- S. Park Ave. and W 9th St.; and
 - o **Street closure** for Park Ave. are between 8th St. to 10th St. (N-S), and closures for 9th St. are between Parcels St. to Gordon St. (E-W)
- S. San Antonio Ave. and E. Franklin Ave.
 - Street closure for San Antonio Ave. are between Phillips Blvd to Lexington Ave. (N-S), and closures for Franklin Ave. are between Towne Ave. to Reservoir St. (E-W)

The ongoing construction at the roundabout locations includes the following key improvements:

- New curb and gutter
- Re-grading and alignment adjustments
- New pavement
- Enhanced pedestrian crosswalks
- Updated signage
- Utility line modifications

There are also utility line modifications that are needed to allow this work to be completed. Please see the photos below for current construction activities:
