## DRAFT HPC RESOLUTION NO. 25-023

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY OF POMONA, CALIFORNIA, HISTORIC PRESERVATION COMMISSION, DETERMINING THAT PROPERTY LOCATED AT 1084 W. MISSION BOULEVARD, IS NOT HISTORIC

## THE HISTORIC PRESERVATION COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF POMONA DOES RESOLVE AS FOLLOWS:

**WHEREAS,** the Applicant, Milad B. Oueijan, submitted an application for Determination of Historic Significance (DHS-000358-2025) to determine the historic significance of the property located at 1084 W. Mission Blvd.;

WHEREAS, the structures are estimated to have been constructed between 1947-1953;

**WHEREAS,** the Historic Preservation Commission must make findings as described in Section .800.C.(9) of the Pomona Zoning & Development Code to make a Determination of Historic Significance;

**WHEREAS,** the Historic Preservation Commission of the City of Pomona, has, after giving notice thereof as required by law, held a public meeting on August 6, 2025, concerning the requested Determination of Historic Significance (DHS-000358-2025); and

**WHEREAS,** the Historic Preservation Commission has carefully considered all pertinent testimony and the staff report offered in the case presented at the public hearing.

**NOW THEREFORE, BE IT HEREBY RESOLVED** by the Historic Preservation Commission of the City of Pomona, California, as follows:

**SECTION 1.** Based on the policies contained in the Pomona General Plan and Historic Preservation Ordinance, the Historic Preservation Commission concludes as follows:

- 1. Preserving Pomona's diverse architectural styles reflecting phases of the City of Pomona's history and encouraging complementary contemporary development inspires a more livable urban environment;
- 2. Pomona's historic places should be preserved to build civic pride by promoting the understanding, appreciation, and enjoyment of the city's rich heritage and cultural resources;
- 3. Preserving Pomona's historic places enhances property values and increase economic and financial benefits to the City;
- 4. Preserving Pomona's historic places enhances the City of Pomona for residents, tourists and

visitors thereby stimulating business and industry; and

5. Preserving Pomona's historic places conserves valuable material and energy resources by fostering ongoing use and maintenance of the existing built environment.

**SECTION 2.** In view of all of the evidence and based on the designation criteria contained in the staff report, the Historic Preservation Commission concludes as follows:

The commercial structures located at 1084 W. Mission Blvd. do not meet the National Register of Historic Places, California Register of Historical Resources, and/or the City of Pomona designation criteria as contained in the City's Historic Preservation Ordinance, and therefore, are not historic.

**SECTION 3.** All documents described in Section 1 of Historic Preservation Commission Resolution No. 25-023 are deemed incorporated by reference as set forth at length.

**SECTION 4.** The Secretary shall certify to the adoption of this Resolution and forward the original to the City Clerk.
