Chair Otero shared that Captain Victor Glover is speaking at The Ebell on February 19, 2024 at 7pm and doing a book signing. She thanked Public Works for quickly fixing potholes before they worsened.

- The Civic Center Park Project is underway and 60% plans were sent to staff for review by the consultant.
- The Parks and Facilities Master Plan received public comment and suggestions may be incorporated into the plan. A community workshop is scheduled to be held soon.
- Movies in the Park planning is underway. Staff are working with Day One to plan six movie nights, one in each District, and ending with a dive-in.
- Staff are planning and booking performers for six summer concerts.
- Staff is submitting a proposal to the school district for Outdoor & Active. The program is
 in its third year of operation and the City is looking to expand youth sports into the
 school district's The Learning Connection program.
- Staff is looking to expand its music program.
- A Recreation Coordinator is starting February 26, 2024, as well as an Administrative Assistant for Outdoor & Active. A Recreation Coordinator for Seniors is currently vacant and recruitment efforts to fill the position will begin soon.
- Staff from Community Services and Public Works will be attending the California Parks and Recreation Society Conference and Expo next week.
- Egg Hunt will be Saturday, March 23, 2024 at Ganesha Park, Martin Luther King, Jr. Park, Ted Greene Park, and Philadelphia Park.
