SUBJECT: RESOLUTION TO AMEND FISCAL YEAR (FY) 2025-26

OPERATING BUDGET BY INCREASING REVENUE ESTIMATES

AND APPROPRIATIONS FOR AVAILABLE GRANT FUNDS

RECOMMENDATION:

It is recommended that the City Council take the following actions:

1) Adopt the following resolution:

RESOLUTION NO. 2025-104—A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF POMONA, CALIFORNIA, AMENDING THE FY 2025-26 OPERATING BUDGET BY INCREASING REVENUE ESTIMATES IN THE AMOUNT OF \$345,367 AND APPROPRIATIONS IN THE AMOUNT OF \$387,324

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY:

Adopting Resolution No. 2025-104 (Attachment No. 1) will amend the FY 2025-26 Operating Budget by increasing revenue estimates in the amount of \$345,367 and appropriations in the amount of \$387,324 by carrying over remaining funds from FY 2024-2025.

PREVIOUS RELATED ACTION:

On September 16, 2024, the City Council amended the FY 2024-25 operating budget and sole-source purchase of ten (10) 2025 Dodge Durango Police Interceptor Utility Vehicles and Vehicle builds in the amount of \$788,248.

On October 21, 2024, the City Council accepted the FY 2024-25 ABC Grant in the amount of \$40,000.

On November 18, 2024, the City Council accepted the FY 2024-25 Tobacco Grant in the amount of \$381,591.

On March 20, 2023, the City Council accepted the FY 2022 Law Enforcement Agency De-Escalation Grant from the Office of Community Oriented Policing Services (COPS) in the amount of \$181,260.

DISCUSSION:

The Pomona Police Department administers and implements over 20 different grants on an annual basis. As Fiscal Year (FY) 2024-25 came to a close, staff identified unexpended funds that had been budgeted for various grant-related activities. In order to continue eligible expenditures, these unspent funds must be re-appropriated for use in FY 2025-26.

These carryover funds originate from projects that were still in progress at the end of FY 2024-25 and require additional time for completion, as well as from programs that did not fully expend their allocated funding during the fiscal year. The re-appropriation will ensure continuity in grant-supported operations and compliance with grant requirements.

COUNCIL PRIORITIES & GOALS: This item supports the 2021-2022 City Council Priority 1: Fiscal and Operational Responsibility – Goal C: Obtain additional grant funding and other revenues to help achieve City goals.
