CALL TO ORDER

Mayor Sandoval called the City Council Meeting to order at 7:01 p.m.

CITY ATTORNEY REPORT OUT FROM CLOSED SESSION

City Attorney Sonia Carvalho stated three closed session items were discussed, and one closed session item was postponed. Councilmember Ontiveros-Cole and Councilmember Torres were both absent from closed session.

PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE

Mayor Sandoval led the Pledge of Allegiance.

PRESENTATIONS

*Proclamation Designating June 2, 2023 as "National Gun Violence Awareness Day" in the City of Pomona

Mayor Sandoval presented the proclamation to Mrs. Romala who accepted the proclamation. She spoke a few words regarding the movement behind finding evidence-based solutions for resolving gun violence and expressed gratitude to City Council and Just Us 4 Youth.

*Proclamation Recognizing the Week of May 21-27, 2023 as "National Public Works Week" in the City of Pomona

Mayor Sandoval presented the proclamation to Public Works Director Rene Guerrero and City Engineer Arnold Dichosa. Director Guerrero shared a few words commending the work done by the staff of Public Works.

MAYOR/COUNCILMEMBER COMMUNICATIONS

Councilmember Garcia stated she attended the California Teachers Association Political Academy and heard speeches from incoming CTA President Mr. Goldberg and Lt. Governor Eleni Kounalakis. She gave thanks to the Library staff for hosting a successful Alice and Mad Hatter Themed Tea event for the community. Councilmember Garcia attended Pomona's Art Walk and wished everyone a Happy Mother's Day. She announced that the Pomona Library will have special summer events, and asked everyone to keep a lookout for when those events are scheduled.

Councilmember Torres also wished everyone a Happy Mother's Day and expressed words of gratitude to his own mother, Norma Torres, to the mother of his children, Marisol Guerra, and to all the maternal figures in his life. He stated Pomona Beautification Day was a great event. He expressed support for law enforcement and the work they do for the community. He gave thanks to those responsible for bringing forth the Gun Violence Awareness Proclamation.

Vice Mayor Nolte attended a Housing Affordability Rent Control and Homelessness Conference because he was invited to sit on a panel and discuss the rent stabilization efforts in Pomona. There he learned about Bill HR1708, which, if passed, will provide federal funding for local efforts to address homelessness.

Councilmember Preciado gave thanks to everyone that attended the Art Walk. He stated the LA County Fair has also been a success. He also announced an upcoming Wellness Fair, hosted by Pomona Unified School District in collaboration with the City. Councilmember Lustro thanked participants that volunteered during Pomona Beautification Day and described the day as a success. He announced the LA County Fair is open Thursday through Sunday from now until May 29, 2023, Memorial Day. He also reminded everyone of the upcoming free vision-screening clinic event, taking place on May 20, at the Village Conference Center on Indian Hill. It is a first-come, first-served event so it is recommended to arrive early; the event begins at 8 a.m.

Mayor Sandoval thanked Councilmember Garcia and Vice Mayor Nolte for each leading a City Council meeting during his absence. He gave thanks to the organizers of the Pomona Beautification Day event. Lastly, he announced that on Tuesday, June 13, at 5 p.m. he would be giving the State of the City address at the FOX Theater in Downtown Pomona. He invited everyone to attend.

CITY MANAGER COMMUNICATIONS

City Manager Makshanoff reminded everyone that the Public Hearing for the Budget Adoption of Fiscal Year 23-24 will take place at the June 5 City Council Meeting. He also advised that the City Council would go dark on June 19 and July 3 because of the holidays. The next City Council meeting after June 5 will take place on July 17.

PUBLIC PARTICIPATION

At the direction of the City Council Emergency Sub Committee, beginning with the July 18, 2022 Council meeting, emailed comments will no longer be read into the record during Council meetings. However, they will be included as part of the record/meeting minutes.

Live Comments were as follows:

Beth Brooks expressed concern with Councilmembers that own property in Pomona have not recused themselves from discussions regarding rent stabilization efforts. She also expressed dissatisfaction with the commercial monopoly for trash services.

Greg Estel discussed the expenses burdening local businesses to acquire security measures against vandalism and loitering. He also expressed opposition to the rent stabilization urgency ordinance.

Peggy Streeter discussed her experience with theft, lack of security, and issues with the building in which she resides. The building she lives in is a senior living complex.

Jerilynne Adams expressed feeling scared in her senior living complex due to a lack of security, and the repeated occurrence of theft and intruders. She also expressed dissatisfaction with Pomona Police's response times.

Michael D. Weber discussed his experience with Tow Zone Towing and warned it is operating in a manner that is violating the vehicle code.

Alex Luevano invited everyone to check out the Community Resource Center at 696 W. Holt Ave., which provides free services to the community. Some of the services offered include CPR classes, Wellness classes and food drives.

Elizabeth Sorin discussed her experience with Pomona PD while going through a civil matter with her property owner.

Mario Ramos also invited everyone to visit the Community Resource Center at 696 W. Holt Ave to benefit from the free resources they have for the community.

 - B. Amount to be determined to Just Us 4 Youth in support of "Taking your Place" Conferences Requested Amount \$8,000
 - C. Amount to be determined to Fist of Gold Youth Center in support of USA Boxing Sanctioned Event– Requested Amount \$2,500
- 2) Receive and file the recap of final amounts.

MOTION BY MAYOR SANDOVAL, SECOND BY COUNCILMEMBER LUSTRO, CARRIED 5-0 (COUNCILMEMBER PRECIADO AND COUNCILMEMBER ONTIVEROS-COLE ABSENT), to make a finding of public benefit for Items A-C.

18. Receive and File a Pavement Management Program (PMP) Presentation Update

It is recommended that the City Council receive and file a Pavement Management Program presentation update.

Public Works Director Rene Guerrero gave a brief introduction.

Councilmember Preciado returned to the dais at 8:15 p.m.

Councilmember Lustro stated he understood that due to limited funds the focus is on preserving roads that are not in orange or red condition, but could there be a way to address the roads that have not been re-paved in decades.

Councilmember Garcia made comments and requested staff to find a way to address the streets in red and orange condition, possibly through a change in policy. Director Guerrero advised that due to limited funds staff was limited to how many of those types of streets may be repaired in a given time period.

Mayor Sandoval requested that staff return with an estimate on what it would take to repair residential streets at an increased rate.

Councilmember Torres inquired about the type of bids the City has received for paving. Director Guerrero advised plenty of bids are received but the costs are very high, higher than average. Councilmember Torres made suggestions on the acquisition of bigger grants.

Councilmember Preciado gave thanks to staff for their responsiveness to councilmember's inquiries and discussed other possible ways of generating additional funds.

This item was a receive and file, therefore no motion was made.

19. Introduction and First Reading of Ordinance to Amend Chapter 62, Article VI of the Pomona City Code

It is recommended that the City Council introduce, waive further and give first reading to the following ordinance:

ORDINANCE NO. 4331 - AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF POMONA, CALIFORNIA, AMENDING THE SECTIONS OF CHAPTER 62 (UTILITIES), ARTICLE VI (SOLID WASTE), DIVISIONS 1 (GENERALLY), 3 (RESIDENTIAL COLLECTION SERVICE RATES AND CHARGES), AND 4 (MULTIFAMILY RESIDENTIAL, COMMERCIAL, INDUSTRIAL AND INSTITUTIONAL SERVICE) OF THE POMONA CITY CODE

Public Works Director Guerrero gave a brief statement.

MOTION BY COUNCILMEMBER LUSTRO, SECOND BY COUNCILMEMBER NOLTE, CARRIED 5-1 (COUNCILMEMBER GARCIA OPPOSED, COUNCILMEMBER ONTIVEROS-COLE ABSENT), to introduce, waive further and give first reading to Ordinance No. 4331.

20. Adopt a Resolution Approving the City of Pomona's American Rescue Plan (ARP) Spending Plan Update and \$400,000 of ARP Funds for the Summer Concerts

It is recommended that the City Council approve the following actions:

1) Adopt the following resolution:

RESOLUTION NO. 2023-80 - A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF POMONA, CALIFORNIA APPROVING THE CITY OF POMONA'S AMERICAN RESCUE PLAN (ARP) SPENDING PLAN UPDATE

2) Authorize the use of \$400,000 of ARP funds (Health and Wellness) for the Summer Concerts for the next four (4) years.

Finance Director Andrew Mowbray and BBK Attorney Andre Monette gave the staff presentation.

Councilmember Torres made comments regarding the importance of committing and using the funds soon to avoid the possibility of the federal government rescinding partial funds.

Councilmember Preciado requested that unattached dollars be used for the re-habilitation of Grand Ave if possible.

Mayor Sandoval made comments and requested to receive spending recommendations from the committee.

Councilmember Garcia agreed with Mayor Sandoval's request, and expressed support for the idea to fund the rehabilitation of Grand Ave with unattached dollars. She also expressed the importance of having multiple centers for youth in the City.

MOTION BY COUNCILMEMBER PRECIADO, SECOND BY COUNCILMEMBER GARCIA, CARRIED 6-0 (COUNCILMEMBER ONTIVEROS-COLE ABSENT), to adopt Resolution No. 2023-80 and authorize the use of \$400,000 of ARP funds (Health and Wellness) for the Summer Concerts for the next four (4) years.
