## DRAFT RESOLUTION NO. 2018-

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF POMONA, CALIFORNIA, RECITING THE FACT OF THE GENERAL MUNICIPAL ELECTION HELD ON NOVEMBER 6, 2018 DECLARING THE OFFICIAL RESULTS AND SUCH OTHER MATTERS AS PROVIDED BY LAW

WHEREAS, a General Municipal Election was held and conducted in the City of Pomona, California, on Tuesday, November 6, 2018 as required by law;

WHEREAS, notice of the election was given in time, form and manner as provided by law; that election officers were appointed and that in all respects the election was held and conducted and the votes were cast, received and canvassed and the returns made and declared in time, form and manner as required by the provisions of the Elections Code of the State of California for the holding of elections in Charter Cities;

WHEREAS, the Los Angeles County Election Department canvassed the returns of the election and has certified the results to this City Council, the results are received, attached and made a part hereof as "Exhibit A."

NOW, THEREFORE, THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF POMONA, CALIFORNIA, DOES RESOLVE, DECLARE, DETERMINE AND ORDER AS **FOLLOWS:**

**SECTION 3.** That the number of votes given at each precinct and the number of votes given in the City to each of the persons above named for the respective office for which the persons were candidates, and for and against the measures, were as listed in "Exhibit A" attached.

**SECTION 4.** The City Council does declare and determine that Victor Preciado was elected as Member of the City Council, District 2 for a full term of four (4) years; Nora Garcia was elected as Member of the City Council, District 3 for a full term of four (4) years; and Steve Lustro was elected as a Member of the City Council, District 5 for a full term of four (4) years.

That as a result of the election, a majority of the voters voting on Measure PG relating to the establishment of a 3/4¢ sales tax in the City of Pomona, did vote in favor of it, and that the measure was carried, and shall be deemed adopted and ratified.

That as a result of the election, a majority of the voters voting on Measure PC relating to the establishment of a cannabis business tax in the City of Pomona, did vote in favor of it, and that the measure was carried, and shall be deemed adopted and ratified.

**SECTION 5.** The City Clerk shall enter on the records of the City Council of the City, a statement of the result of the election showing: (1) The whole number of votes (ballots) cast in the City; (2) The names of the persons voted for; (3) The measures voted upon; (4) For what office each person was voted for; (5) The number of votes given at each precinct to each person, and for and against each measure; (6) The total number of votes given to each person, and for and against each measure.

**SECTION 6.** That the City Clerk shall immediately make and deliver to each of the persons so elected a Certificate of Election signed by the City Clerk and authenticated; that the City Clerk shall also administer to each person elected the Oath of Office prescribed in the Constitution of the State of California and shall have them subscribe to it and file it in the office of the City Clerk. Each and all of the persons so elected shall then be inducted into the respective office to which they have been elected.

**SECTION 7.** That the City Clerk shall certify to the passage and adoption of this resolution and enter it into the book of original resolutions.
