**WALNUT —** Development of Winnett Ranch as a community park was apparently "delayed" by the City Council Wednesday night, backers of the project believe.

Councilmen made no comment after receiving the final feasibility report and preliminary plan for development of the 80-acre ranch. Instead, they quickly appointed council members **William Wentworth** and **William Cotten** to study the plan.

In sharp contrast to heated debate that ensued in January when a preliminary draft of the plan was presented to councilmen, this time they sidestepped the issue.

**Cotten** and Councilman **Robert Lovemark**, both strong backers of the park project, said after the meeting they saw only a "glimmer of hope" that the ranch would be developed. Through council action, the project has been "delayed," Cotten said.

A major reason for acquiring the site is to convert the main ranch house at 20011 La Puente Road into a new civic center, Cotten declared.

But Lovemark claims that

other council members such as **Richard Laughter** and **Wentworth** want to build a new city hall on the Brea Canyon Cutoff, and drop the park project. He said this was a key issue in the recent council election.

"The ranch house would be a good site for city hall and different from other civic centers," Lovemark added. Projected purchase and development costs of the ranch are about \$1 million, according to the final report presented by planning consultant **Lampman and Associates**. However, a \$547,218 development cost includes too many "extras" which could be eliminated, said Cotten. He estimated the total project

with the main ranch house city hall, main barn and community center, and a set aside for ballfields, children's play, bike trails.

and learned all the details of the business. He also attended the dairy school of the Iowa State College at Ames, Iowa, and thus further perfected himself. For nine months, too, he was a student at Pomona College, while Freeman, his brother, was graduated from that famous institution with the Class of '14. Pomona Valley may well congratulate these aggressive and enterprising young men of affairs.

### REGINALD L. KNOX

The descendant of two generations of pioneers in the state, and himself a native Californian, with two sons to carry on the family name in the upbuilding of their communities, Reginald L. Knox can be called a name-worthy representative of a pioneer family and typical of the public spirited and sturdy stock from which he descended. Born in Los Angeles, May 23, 1884, he is the son of George C. and Maria R. (Langenberger) Knox; his mother was also born in the Golden State; and his grandfather, Gustavus A. Langenberger, came here in 1849, one of the Argonauts of gold mining days who came to seek his fortune and remained to lay the foundation for prosperity in the state. His father, George C. Knox, served as an engineer in the Confederate Army during the Civil War, and after the close of the war, came west to California and was one of the engineering corps that made the survey of the Pacific Coast. He has passed to his reward, but the mother of the family is still living. This pioneer couple were the parents of five children, four boys and one girl.

The third child born to his parents, Reginald L. Knox was educated in the public schools of Los Angeles, and had one year in the high school of that city. He then entered the employ of the Southern California Fruit Exchange, now the California Fruit Growers Exchange, in December, 1899; was sent by the company to San Francisco in 1906, and in 1908 came to Pomona and took a position as assistant to Mr. Dreher, the manager of the San Antonio Fruit Exchange. In 1917, Mr. Knox became secretary and manager for the last-named company and has since filled that position with credit to himself and his employers.

The marriage of Mr. Knox, on November 4, 1915, united him with Miss Kate Jordan, and two sons have blessed their union: Reginald L., Jr., and Robert Jordan. In fraternal circles Mr. Knox is a member of the Masonic order; he is a member of the Chamber of Commerce of Pomona, and takes an active interest in all civic affairs and movements. Patriotic to a degree, he served as captain during the local war drives, and in all projects for the general welfare he can be counted on to do his share. With his family, he attends the Episcopal Church; in politics he supports the men best qualified for office.







EDGAR KNOX Edgar Guerin Knox of Chico, passed away peacefully on October 24, 2014, after a lengthy illness. A fifth generation Californian, he was born in Pomona, on October 20, 1929, the son of Reginald and Kate Jordan Knox. He graduated from Pomona High School, received his BA at UC, Berkeley, his MA at Mexico City College, and his PhD at USC. He was drafted into the army and served in the Counter Intelligence Corps during the Korean War. In 1955 he worked for the US State Department in Germany in the Refugee Resettle-ment Program. There he met his first wife, Erika L. Gentinne. They married in 1959 and lived in California. Their daughter, Kate, was born in 1964. Erika died in 1978. He joined the CSU Chico, faculty in 1965 as Professor of German and served as Chairman of the Department of Foreign Languages from 1970 to 1973, was a member of the Academic Senate, and retired in 1992. He was devoted to his students, encouraged their mastery of the German language, and led various student groups to Europe as participants in the Experiment in International Living. In 1992, he married Louisiana "Missy" Clayton Dart, whom he had first met years before in Mexico City. They shared a love of travel and adventure in their 22 years together. He was a skilled aviator, earning his pilot's license at age 15 and retiring from flying at age 82 when he

gave his last plane, a Taylorcraft Model D, to WYES TV, the station's first airplane donation. He owned and flew many different planes and he and Missy made many wonderful flights in the United States and Baja California. He was an active member of the Experimental Aircraft Association and encouraged young people in aviation in the EAA's Young Eagles program. He enjoyed classical music and attended opera and symphony performances in many countries. He was an avid reader of history and the classics and read in English, German, Spanish and French. He was an enthusiastic supporter of the Salvation Army, the North State Symphony, the Environmental Defense Fund, the National Wildlife Federation and was a Life Member of the Sierra Club. He was preceded in death by his three brothers, Reginald Knox of La Jolla, William Knox of Davis, and James Knox of Stuart, Florida. He is survived by his wife, Missy, his daughter, Kate (Mikhail) Knox, of Oakland, his step-daughters Anna (Andrew) Farrell of Chico, and Melissa Scheinuk of Rome, Italy, his step-sons, Edward (Susan) Scheinuk of New Orleans, and Jackson Scheinuk of Dusseldorf, Germany, his nine step-grandchildren Harry, Jacqueline, Taylor, Hilary, Emerson, Giovanni, Lucrezia, Cesare and Cosimo, numerous nieces and nephews and their children. ## William Jordan Knox



William Jordan Knox of Davis took his insatiable curiosity with him when he passed away at home on July 7 at the age of 92.

Knox, an emeritus professor of physics at the University of California, Davis, was a witty and generous polymath. He read everything, from Patrick O'Brien sea stories to the densest philosophy, with equal relish. He was always ready to explain the phenomena of the cosmos in colorful and accessible terms, from the molecular to the galactic in scale; one Japanese colleague translated his name into characters that meant, loosely, "he who considers the very great and the very small." Knox loved being outdoors, whether body surfing in the ocean, hiking his beloved Sierra in search of the elusive Washington lily, or tinkering to achieve the hottest chiles, the sweetest melons and the biggest pumpkins in his prodigious gardens.

Descended from settlers who came to California with Father Serra and subsequent expeditions, Knox was born in Pomona when it was a farm community among orange and walnut groves. He attended UC Berkeley, and while still an undergraduate in chemistry was selected by Glenn Seaborg to become a member of the secret Manhattan Project team tasked with creating the atomic bomb. Throughout World War II, Knox shuttled among sites including Fermi Laboratory in Chicago; Hanford, Washington; and Oak Ridge, Tennessee, working on production and separation of plutonium, which was used in the first atomic bomb tested in New Mexico. He was proud to have been one of the Manhattan Project scientists to sign a letter urging President Truman to detonate the bomb at sea as a demonstration of its might rather than to drop it on a city. After the war, Knox received his Ph.D. in physics from UC Berkeley,



worked at the Atomic Energy Commission in Washington on peaceful uses for nuclear energy, and was an assistant professor at Yale University before moving to Davis in 1960. At UC Davis, he helped develop the physics program, serving as chairman, while the department grew rapidly through the 1960s and 1970s. For many years, he also served in the University of California Academic Senate.

Knox met his wife, Barbara, and many of his lifelong friends, while living at International House at UC Berkeley; friends remember him bouncing up and down the I-House steps on a pogo stick, wearing a beanie cap with a propeller on it. He was an accomplished pianist, who also sang and played guitar with friends. He and Barbara married in Southampton, England, in 1948. During their 65-year marriage, they continued to travel, entertain, and host foreign students and professors. They spent summers in a cabin at Echo Lake — sailing, hiking, swimming and watching the Perseid meteor showers.

Knox was among the first in Davis to protest the war in Vietnam in 1963, and he took his four children to peace marches in San Francisco. He was an early and active supporter of the civil rights movement, and was active in local politics, including serving as treasurer for Dick Holdstock's City Council campaign in 1972.

Friends and family will miss his deadpan sense of humor and lopsided smile. He is survived by Barbara; daughters Margaret (Dan Baum) and Sarah (David Zander); sons William Jr. (Kate Markey) and Reggie (Michelle Jarnagin); grandchildren Alan Knox, Adele Markey, Rosa Baum, Paul Zander, Isaac Mirzadegan, Tomás Jarnagin-Cleary and Genevieve Jarnagin Knox; and brother Edgar Knox (Louisiana).
