

**RESOLUTION NO. 2019-42**

**A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF POMONA, CALIFORNIA, APPROVING THE CITY'S STREET PROJECTS LISTS, WITH CORRESPONDING CAPITAL IMPROVEMENT PROGRAM (CIP), AND RELATED PUBLIC WORKS OPERATIONAL ITEM LIST PLAN TO THE CALIFORNIA TRANSPORTATION COMMISSION (CTC) TO BE ELIGIBLE FOR FISCAL YEAR 2019-20 RMRA/SB-1 FUNDING**

**WHEREAS**, Senate Bill 1 (SB-1), the Road Repair and Accountability Act of 2017 (Chapter 5, Statutes of 2017) was passed by the Legislature and Signed into law by the Governor in April 2017 to address the significant multi-modal transportation funding shortfalls statewide; and

**WHEREAS**, SB-1 includes accountability and transparency provisions that will ensure the residents of our City of Pomona are aware of the projects proposed for funding in our community and which projects have been completed each fiscal year; and

**WHEREAS**, the City of Pomona must adopt by resolution a list of projects proposed to receive fiscal year funding from the Road Maintenance and Rehabilitation Account (RMRA), created by SB-1, which must include a description and the location of each proposed project, a proposed schedule for the project's completion, and the estimated useful life of the improvement; and

**WHEREAS**, the City of Pomona will receive an estimated \$2,576,874 in RMRA funding in Fiscal Year 2019-20 from SB-1; and

**WHEREAS**, this is the third year in which the City of Pomona is receiving SB-1 funding and will enable the City of Pomona to continue essential road maintenance and rehabilitation projects, safety improvements, repairing and replacing aging bridges, and increasing access and mobility options for the traveling public that would not have otherwise been possible without SB-1; and

**WHEREAS**, the City of Pomona has undergone a robust public process to ensure public input into our community's transportation priorities/the project list; and

**WHEREAS**, the City of Pomona used its Pavement Management Program to develop the SB-1 project list to ensure revenues are being used on the most high-priority and cost-effective projects that also meet the communities priorities for transportation investment; and

**WHEREAS**, the funding from SB-1 will help the City of Pomona maintain and rehabilitate 14 streets/roads throughout the City of Pomona this year (between July 2019 and December 2020) and into the future; and

**WHEREAS**, the 2018 California Statewide Local Streets and Roads Needs Assessment found that the City of Pomona streets and roads are in at-risk condition and this revenue will help us manage

the overall quality of our road system and over the next decade will bring our streets and roads into a at-risk condition; and

**WHEREAS**, the SB-1 project list and overall investment in our local streets and roads infrastructure with a focus on basic maintenance and safety, investing in complete streets infrastructure, and using cutting-edge technology, materials and practices, will have significant co-benefits statewide.

**WHEREAS**, the City Council desires to include the eligible RMRA/SB-1 funding to the Capital Improvement Program (CIP) Project description for “Street Preservation – Local Citywide (FY 19-20),” Project No. 428-2590-XXXXX-68561

**WHEREAS**, receipt of RMRA/SB-1 Local Street funding will require approval of the proposed Fiscal Year 2019-20 Public Works Operational Items List for qualified expenditures.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED** by the City Council of the City of Pomona as follows:

**SECTION 1.** The foregoing recitals are true and correct.

**SECTION 2.** The following list of proposed projects will be funded in-part or solely with fiscal year 2019-20 Road Maintenance and Rehabilitation Account revenues and the City Council hereby approves the Fiscal Year 2019-20 list of projects planned to be funded with Road Maintenance and Rehabilitation Account revenues included in the CIP Project “Street Preservation – Local Citywide (FY 19-20),” Project No. 428-2590-XXXXX-68561 by modifying the project description to include the following Street Preservation 2019-2020 projects list description, and approves submittal to the CTC:

Landscape Median Maintenance	\$160,000	Landscape Median and Maintenance is routine maintenance that is provided through contracted services. Citywide landscape median maintenance includes mowing, weed control, pest control, irrigation, debris and trash removal, maintenance and trimming of trees, shrubs and ground cover, and mulching.
Street Maintenance On-Call Street and Sidewalk Repair	\$150,000	There is a need to perform as-needed asphalt repairs, including potholes and patchwork repairs, Citywide. The City's Streets Division repairs many potholes, sections with broken asphalt, and other areas requiring service, on a daily basis. The City plans to provide for these additional as-needed asphalt repair services through a contract. The locations that will be assigned for repair services consist of residential and arterial roadways and highways. The City is also in need of additional repairs to sidewalks, curbs and gutters. The City currently has an on-call contractor to repair sidewalks on an as-needed basis. Currently, Article II monies have been the only funds that have been appropriated for these services in years past. The proposed action will provide program approval for on-call asphalt repairs and sidewalk repair services.
Traffic Signal and Street Light - Asset Management System/Work Order System	\$100,000	The City has solicited a formal bid for a work-order management system. To feed additional data into the work-order management system, Staff recommends that an outside consultant compile an inventory of all City-owned lights, traffic signals, street signs, and posts to subsequently integrate this information into a Geographic Information System (GIS). The cost for these services is estimated at \$100,000.

**SECTION 4.** The City Manager is hereby authorized to execute all documents required for receipt of RMRA/SB-1, Measure M, and Measure R funding, including annual reporting forms, and any documents that may be required by legislative funding guidelines.

**SECTION 5.** The City Council shall attest and certify to the passage and adoption of this resolution and it shall become effective immediately upon its approval.
