SUBJECT: SECOND READING AND ADOPTION OF ORDINANCE NO. 4265 AMENDING POMONA CITY CODE SECTION 58-164 TO DISALLOW TEMPORARY PARKING AT RED CURBS WHILE LOADING OR UNLOADING MERCHANDISE OR PASSENGERS

RECOMMENDATION: It is recommended that the City Council adopt, at second reading, Ordinance No. 4265 (Attachment No. 1) amending Section 58-164 of the Pomona City Code pertaining to exceptions for parking and stopping at red curb zones and areas.

FISCAL IMPACT:

There is no fiscal impact with the proposed Code amendment. The Police Department may realize some increase in General Fund revenue with the elimination of exceptions for parking at red curbs.

PREVIOUS RELATED ACTION: On July 15, 2019, the City Council introduced the first reading of Ordinance No. 4265, amending the Pomona City Code Section 58-164 to disallow temporary parking at red curbs while loading or unloading merchandise or passengers. On August 3, 2015, the City adopted Ordinance No. 4208, which primarily established a Downtown Parking Zone and modified time limit parking restrictions Downtown. The Ordinance also added language that allowed temporary parking at red curbs if actually engaged in loading or unloading of merchandise or passengers.

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY: As currently written, Pomona City Code (PCC) Section 58-164 allows an exception to no parking at red curbs "temporarily for the purpose of, and while actually engaged in, loading and unloading of merchandise or passengers ..." Under the California Vehicle Code (CVC) § 21458(a)(1), parking is prohibited when a curb is painted red. The proposed Ordinance will amend said PCC Section 58-164 to be consistent with State law.

DISCUSSION: The language added to PCC Sec. 58-164 by Ordinance No. 4208 was intended to benefit certain business areas in the City that have limited loading areas, and require loading and unloading access from curbs where no parking is allowed and the curbs are painted red. The

added language to allow temporary parking while actually loading or unloading of merchandise or passengers inadvertently impacted the Police Department's ability to effectively use video enforcement for violations of red curb parking at school sites.

CVC Sec. 21458(a), et seq., sets forth the colors of paint to be used on curbs, whenever local agencies use painted curbs to enforce parking regulations, and what the specified colors regulate. CVC Sec. 21458(a)(1) states "Red indicates no stopping, standing, or parking, whether the vehicle is attended or unattended, except that a bus may stop in a red zone marked or signposted as a bus loading zone. CVC Sec. 21458 provides that a local ordinance may be adopted to specify the time allowed for loading or unloading passengers or freight (yellow curb), stopping to unload passengers or depositing mail (white curb) or time limit parking (green curb).

PCC Article IV, Stopping, Standing or Parking, Division 2, Loading Zones, sets forth the time restrictions for yellow, white and green curbs, as allowed under CVC Sec. 21458(a)(1),(2),(3) and (4). There is no parking deviation for blue curbs, which is limited exclusively to vehicles of disabled persons and disabled veterans.

CONCLUSION: The proposed ordinance will bring PCC Sec. 58-164 into conformance with State law regarding the use of painted curbs by a local agency for enforcement of parking violations. The provisions of the ordinance will become effective 30 days after its adoption. At that time, temporary parking at a painted red curb for the purpose of loading and unloading of passengers will be a citable offense under PCC Sec. 58-164(3).
