CRAFTSMAN BUNGALOW 1905



This shed-roof style Craftsman sits on a high, five step-up rock foundation, and exhibits strong Colonial Revival influences. A stately, full width front porch sits beneath the structure's single transverse gable supported by four, widely spaced, tapered columns. The broad sloping roof with its gentle rake is broken by a modest, inset open sleeping porch covered by a front-facing gable. The symmetry of the front elevation is accentuated by two triple windows on either side of the front door which has full length sidelights. The windows are one-over-one double-hungs flanking a center transom window with an unusual repeated circular pattern in each transom. The house is covered by clapboard siding with shingled siding in the eaves. There are window boxes on each side. On the left, two windows are visible. On the right, the box has three high windows and houses a dining room built-in.
