## CRAFTSMAN BUNGALOW 1911



This attractive, clean-lined house is a beautiful example of the Craftsman Bungalow. The double-gabled roof lends visual interest to the front of the house and enhances the box-like structure of the house. The decorative air vents set off each gable roof line. Clapboard siding is present. Two large windows on the front porch are surrounded by broad window frames. The front door has the same broad frames. The front gable covers the front porch and is supported by squared wood columns at the corners. A fieldstone foundation supports the structure.

D. H. and Belle Gemelle are the first listed owners of this

house built in 1911. He was a cement contractor.
