MAY 10, 2021 SPECIAL CITY COUNCIL MEETING PUBLIC COMMENTS

DISCUSSION CALENDAR ITEM NO. 1 (Fiscal Year 2021-22 Budget Study Session)

MEGAN GEARHART – My name is Megan Gearhart. This year I have the privilege of serving as the chair of the Library Board of Trustees. I am pleased to see in the 2021-2022 budget that the city is choosing to increase library funding this year. I recently read an article from the American Library Association that estimates for every dollar a city spends on libraries there is a return of investment of between 2 and 8 dollars. I use our physical library and digital services regularly and estimate I've saved about \$5,000 this year thanks to the services our library provides. I know I am just one of many Pomona citizens who benefit from our library and much of that benefit is harder to quantify. I hope the budget increase is part of a larger positive trend as I know this Mayor and city council cares deeply about investing in Pomona.

LIDIA MANZANARES – My name is Lidia Manzanares and I am a Pomona resident. Thank you for hosting this open budget study session. I am writing to ask you to consider establishing an Equity review and analysis process as part of your budget process. As a Pomona resident, I would appreciate an Equity analysis of programs that will be impacted by budget cuts and an affirmation that certain communities are not shouldering the burden of the cuts more than others. An equity analysis would ideally also be done for any programming. Many cities big and small across the country are adopting this practice. I would also like to emphasize the importance of program evaluations and making those evaluations accessible to the public. Residents should be able to easily look up the goals and other metrics for a variety of programs and track their successes and short comings and how that all ties to the budget process. Did this program achieve its stated goals? Was it an efficient use of money? Evaluating and publicly releasing findings of programs can not only help inform future policy decisions, but it can also show residents where money is going and how effectively it's being used in a more meaningful way.
