Dear Ms. Butler:

Attached please find the Report from the Charter Review Commission 2020, including the Proposed Amendments to the Pomona City Charter, submitted pursuant to Article XVII of the City Charter.

Please place the following measures, with the suggested ballot questions, on the November 8, 2022 General Municipal Election ballot for consideration by the City of Pomona electorate:

#### (A) For the Local Primary Measure:

"Shall the City Charter be amended to establish a local primary election for	YES
the office of Mayor and City Councilmember to coincide with the	•
Statewide Primary Election, beginning in the year 2024; whereby if a	
candidate secures majority voter approval in the local primary, he or she	NO
will be elected, and if no candidate secures majority voter approval, the	NO
top two candidates shall stand for a run-off election to coincide with the	
Statewide General Election?".	

#### (B) For the Term Limits Measure:

"Shall the City Charter be amended to enact a three consecutive term limit	YES
on elected service in Pomona, whether serving as Mayor or as a Council	
Member, followed by a four-year "cooling off" period after serving three	
consecutive terms during which a person may not serve on the City	NO
Council?"	NO

#### (C) For the Independent Redistricting Commission Measure:

"Shall the City Charter be amended to create an independent citizens'	YES
redistricting commission of Pomona residents who shall determine the	
boundaries of City Council electoral districts every ten years or as needed	
after the United States Census in accordance with applicable Federal and	NO
State law?"	NO

#### (D) For the Police Commission Measure

"Shall the City Charter be amended to create a police commission of	YES
Pomona residents who shall be authorized to receive community	
complaints and concerns about police matters; to review, investigate and	
report on incidents in connection with the Pomona Police Department;	
and to advise City officials and conduct public outreach on	NO
policing/community relations issues?"	

#### (E) For the Resign to Run Measure:

"Shall the City Charter be amended to establish a "resign to run" rule	YES
whereby any current City Councilmember running for Mayor must resign	
his or her Council seat if the new Mayoral term will begin before the City	NO
Councilmember's current term ends?"	

## (F) For the Realignment of District Elections Measure:

nall the City Charter be amended to change the sequencing of City	YES

ndidates for Mayor and Councilmember from Electoral Districts 1, 2 and	
will run for election in Presidential election years and candidates for	NO

### (G) For the Campaign Finance Measure:

"Shall the City Charter be amended to change the City's campaign finance	YES
and conflict of interest laws; including updates to the City's campaign	
contribution limits, voluntary expenditure ceiling, rules for use of surplus	
campaign funds and mandating disclosure of certain campaign	
contributions by a Councilmember prior to casting a vote on a City matter	NO
where the contributor is the applicant?"	

#### (H) For the General Charter Update Measure:

"Shall the City Charter be amended to make various updates and	YES
clarifications to City policy, including addition of a preamble outlining the	
City's values, adding an Ethics Commission, updating rules for filling	
Mayoral and Council vacancies, increasing notice of public meetings,	NO.
updating rules for appointed commissions and boards, and making various	NO
other technical changes as specified therein?"

# REPORT OF THE CITY OF POMONA CHARTER REVIEW COMMISSION 2020 June 24, 2021

DRAFT 5/28/2021

The Member of the Charter Review Commission 2020 are as follows:

Pursuant to Article XVII of the City Charter, the Charter Review Commission has determined that the following charter amendments be placed on the ballot as separate measures for the November 8, 2022 General Municipal Election:

- 1. Primary election (Attachment A)
- 2. Term Limits (Attachment B)
- 3. Independent Redistricting Commission (Attachment C)
- 4. Police Commission (Attachment D)
- 5. Resign to Run (Attachment E)
- 6. Realignment of District Elections (Attachment F) May be combined with Resign to Run
- 7. Campaign Finance (Attachment G) May be included with General
- 8. General Charter Update (Attachment H)
  - Adds a preamble to reflect City values
  - Updates and/or clarifies a variety of provisions, such as outdated terms, cost of living Indexes, election timelines, and website posting requirements
  - Revises how Council vacancies are filled
  - Revises language regarding Boards and Commissions (Section 403)
  - Adds an Ethics Commission
  - Describes power and duties of City Council members (Section 501)
  - Increases agenda posting deadlines for meetings of the City Council, Boards, and Commissions
  - Eliminates requirement to appoint the City Manager for an indefinite term (Section 601)
  - Requires a report to the City Council every 5 years related to incentives for employees to become residents.
  - Eliminates the Finance Director as an office within the City Charter, in recognition that it is more of a staff level position (Section 701 and other various sections)
  - Adds a reporting requirement regarding the residency of City employees and incentives
  - Clarifies the independence of the Charter Review Commission
  - Other various language clarifications
