EXECUTIVE SUMMARY:

Annually, the Housing Services Division administers and implements over 15 different grants, totaling over \$30 million in program funds. As FY 2020-21 came to a close, staff identified unexpended funds budgeted for various activities in FY 2020-21 which must be appropriated in FY 2021-22 for expenditure authority. These funds come from projects that were either underway at the time the fiscal year changed and need to be brought forward to complete the projects, or programs that had funding that was not fully expended during the previous fiscal year.

Additionally, funding currently appropriated in the FY 2021-22 Operating Budget will be reappropriated to adjust revenue estimates and appropriate funding to eligible activities. The City may amend its Consolidated Plan and the FY 2021-22 Annual Action Plan by holding a public hearing giving citizens the opportunity to comment on proposed budget changes.

FISCAL IMPACT: This action will adjust the current year's FY 2021-22 Operating Budget by increasing revenue estimates and appropriating unspent funds available from the prior fiscal year as well as align revenue estimates to appropriations that were unallocated during the budget process. Additionally, there will be a total increase to the FY 2021-22 Capital Improvement Program Budget (CIP) by \$380,000 in revenue estimates and appropriations in the same amount as a result of adding two new CIP projects.

Amendments to the Consolidated Plan, 2021-22 Annual Action Plan, 2021-22 City Operating Budget, and 2021-22 CIP Budget for CDBG-CV and ESG-CV Funds Page 5 of 6 – September 20, 2021

PREVIOUS COUNCIL RELATED ACTION: On May 17, 2021, the City Council adopted the FY 2021-22 Annual Action Plan, which approved the proposed fund distribution for the Community Development Block Grant Program. On June 7, 2021, the City Council adopted the FY 2021-22 City Operating Budget and the FY 2021-22 Capital Improvement Program (CIP) Budget.

DISCUSSION:

The City of Pomona currently receives Community Development Block Grant (Fund 194) CARES Act Coronavirus (CDBG-CV) and Emergency Solutions Grant (Fund 193) CARES Act Coronavirus funds from the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD). At the close of FY 2020-21, various funding sources had unexpended fund balances, including CDBG-CV and ESG-CV funds. It is recommended that funding be carried forward to the FY 2021-22 Operating Budget to continue program implementation of existing activities, as well as reallocation of funding to eligible activities.

Additionally, after completing the FY 2021-22 budgeting process, staff realized that various funds had budgeted revenue, with no offset to appropriations. With this action the budget will be aligned so that revenue estimates and appropriations balance.

Proposed reallocations of available funding is as follows:

- Park Improvements ADA Accessibility Rubberized Playground Surfacing Replacement: This new CIP project will replace and expand current rubberized playground surfaces to comply with ADA standards at various city parks. CDBG-CV CARES Act funding is being used for this in keeping with CDC guidelines to encourage outdoor activity in local parks during the pandemic.
- 2. <u>Park Improvements HVAC System Replacement:</u>

This new CIP project consists of an energy efficiency upgrade, which will also improve ventilation at Palomares Park Community Seniors Center. The energy efficiency upgrade will be to replace the HVAC System. CDBG-CV CARES Act funding is being used for this in keeping with CDC guidelines to improve ventilation as an important COVID-19 prevention strategy.

 <u>Emergency Shelter – Acquisition/Rehabilitation for Crisis Housing</u>: This project will identify and purchase a multi-family housing complex to be used for interim housing of homeless persons in crisis. Once property is identified, staff will request Council approval to create a CIP project for this activity.

COUNCIL PRIORITIES & GOALS: This supports the FY 2019/20 City Council Priority 1: Fiscal and Operational Responsibility – Goal C: Obtain additional grant funding and other revenues to help achieve City goals.
