CITY MANAGER COMMUNICATIONS

PUBLIC PARTICIPATION

Orlando Arias expressed his interest in volunteering at Hope for Home.

Margaret Velarde commented that the City needed to have a plan for low-income housing to secure housing for Pomona residents.

Derek Engdahl requested that the City Council work on an affordable housing plan.

Eric Trypucko informed he and the Phillips Ranch Ad-Committee members were requesting an investigation regarding claims that Greentech personnel was performing landscaping work on Councilmember Escobar's property. He submitted copies of the images he captured to Interim-City Clerk Marie Macias.

Daniel Luevanos, One Legacy Donate Life, provided information on how to register nationwide for organ donation.

Arturo Jimenez and John Clifford read into the record a letter on behalf of the Pomona Valley Democratic Club requesting that the City Council terminate the City's relationship with current City Attorney Alvarez-Glasman & Colvin law firm.

Guillermo R. Gonzalez informed he was a organ donor recipient; he stated that he was in support of terminating the current contract with the City Attorney.

Lisa Levy Buch, Chief Foothill Gold Line Authority, briefed the City Council on the status of the Gold Line extension project. He informed that the cost for the project was thousands of dollars above what was initially budgeted.

Roberta Pearlman spoke on the Special Meeting held on November 30, 2018, and thanked the outgoing Councilmembers for their service to the community. She thanked Councilmember Carrizosa for taking a stance on difficult issues in the community and standing firmly on her beliefs.

The applicant Ben Steckler stated it would be acceptable to have the hearing in January.

Councilmember Carrizosa requested that her motion be withdrawn. Councilmember Ontiveros-Cole withdrew her second.

Elinor Crescenzi thanked the City Council for bringing forward a zero waste resolution. She expressed her concerns regarding orientation priorities and stated the importance of knowing where the organic waste will be dumped, and the importance of not creating or adding to other communities' problems.

Public Works Director Meg McWade informed that the green waste is taken to the City of Riverside, turned into mulch, and then used as compost. She stated the cost to hire consultants as the City of Santa Monica has done would cost close to \$200,000 and that the City of Pomona did not have the budget.

Councilmember Carrizosa inquired and City Manager Linda Lowry informed that if the City Council wished to make mention of Ms. Crescenzi's concerns, she would like to craft the language in a way that shows the City's awareness and desire, but does not create a commitment that the City cannot make.

The City Council further discussed this item and requested that Staff revise the resolution addressing Zero Waste and bring it back for approval at the December 3, 2018 City Council meeting.

MOTION BY COUNCILMEMBER ROBLEDO, SECOND BY COUNCILMEMBER CARRIZOSA, CARRIED 7-0, to approve the concept of the Residential Organics Pilot Program, and bring back a revised resolution addressing Zero Waste at the next Regular City Council meeting on December 3, 2018.

MOTION BY COUNCILMEMBER GONZALEZ, SECOND BY COUNCILMEMBER CARRIZOSA, CARRIED 7-0, to Receive and file the FY 2017-2018 Unaudited Year-End Overview, Review the Fiscal Year (FY) 2018-19 General Fund 1st Quarter Budget Report, and Resolution No. 2018-159 amending the Fiscal Year 2018-19--2019 adopted Operating Budget, Resolution No. 2018-160 amending Appendix B of the Memorandum of Understanding between the City of Pomona and the Pomona Mid-Management / Confidential Employees' Association and amending the authorized staffing levels in the police department for the Fiscal Year 2018-2019 operating budget by the actions listed herein, and Resolution No. 2018-161 approving amendments to the City of Pomona's Salary Schedule to meet the California Code of Regulations (CCR) title 2, sections 570.5 and 571

PUBLIC HEARINGS

24. Public Hearing to Consider Introduction and First Reading of an Ordinance Amending Sections .435 - 437 of the "F" Fairgrounds Zoning District (F-Zone) of the Pomona City Code (Code Amendment CODE 009778-2018).

This item was heard before the Consent Calendar.

Development Services Director Mario Suarez provided a brief presentation on this item to the City Council. He informed that several comments has been received in support of option B on the staff report, which was the development agreement.

Alfred Fraijo deferred to Mr. Miguel Santa to make remarks on behalf of the Fairplex.

John A. Forbing stated he opposed the proposed ordinance.

Michael Rodriguez, Los Angeles County Chief Real Estate Division, opposed any amendments to the F-Zone and stated that Los Angeles County was not in agreement with any of the changes and that the County needed time to evaluate the changes.

Judy St. John stated she was in favor of the proposed ordinance.

David B. McElwan stated he was in opposition of the proposed ordinance.

Anne Henderson stated she was in opposition of the proposed ordinance.

Mario Ramos on behalf of Protect Our Neighborhood thanked the City Council for taking their time to look in the issue and that they were happy to have come to some agreement. He expressed concerns regarding additional concerts at the Fairplex, and the issue of increased traffic and noise.

Patricia Anderson stated she was in favor of the proposed ordinance and felt it was a win-win situation for the residents and the Fairplex.

Dr. Pinedo, L.A. County Fair Association and Board, stated he was happy to say that together they were able to develop a proposal to meet the needs of the City and that he was in favor of Option B.

Miguel Santana, spoke on the Fairplex's efforts and outreach to engage the surrounding community to address concerns. He informed that together with Mayor Sandoval and Councilmember Torres they were able to develop the proposal that was before the City Council.

Lucas Rivera expressed the importance of acknowledging differences and create opportunities for the community.

Ramon Zavala was not present to speak.

Jerard Wright Bizfed expressed his opposition to the amendments.

Erica Frausto expressed that she opposed the amendments as presented on the agenda, she requested that the City continue to work with the Fairplex and that the Chamber of Commerce was in support of Option B.

A congressional representative from the Office of Congresswoman Norma Torres read into the record a letter from the urging the City Council to move forward with the development agreement between the Fairplex and City of Pomona.

Jane Brooks did not wish to speak.

Jill Start did not wish to speak.

Beth Brooks stated she was in opposition, but did not wish to speak.

Discussion ensued amongst the City Council. Mayor Sandoval expressed putting an end to the proposed draft ordinance. MOTION BY MAYOR SANDOVAL, SECOND BY COUNCILMEMBER ONTIVEROS-COLE, to disapprove the draft ordinance and never bring it before the City Council again.

MOTION BY COUNCILMEMBER TORRES, to table Mayor Sandoval's motion. He stated that he did not want to limit the City's power and to keep options open.

Councilmember Carrizosa expressed the need to hear each other's viewpoints before drawing a conclusion.

After further discussion, Councilmember Torres proposed moving forward with Option B.

MOTION BY COUNCILMEMBER TORRES, SECOND BY COUNCILMEMBER ESCOBAR, to table Mayor Sandoval's initial motion.

Mayor Sandoval stated that the proposal brought forward to the City Council in the future should be viewed by the community and that community meetings should be held.

The City Council requested that the agreement be brought back to the City Council at the first meeting in February.

MOTION BY COUNCILMEMBER TORRES, SECOND BY COUNCILMEMBER ESCOBAR, CARRIED 7-0, direct Staff to prepare a Development Agreement with Fairplex for the creation of a Specific Plan and Environmental Impact Report for Fairplex Site based on terms outlined in the November 13, 2018 Fairplex Letter, include the Los Angeles County representatives in the discussion, and bring the item back to the City Council on February 4, 2018.

Mayor Sandoval stated he would like to discuss in January the opportunity to improvements to the Code Enforcement Department.

Councilmembers Carrizosa and Escobar acknowledged Marie Macias, Interim City Clerk, for coming back to City of Pomona after her retirement to assist with the City Clerk Department and the recruitment of a new City Clerk.
