Staff will call on you one at a time and each speaker will have up to (3) minutes for their comment.

## **DISCUSSION**

1. (Discussion Calendar Item No. 17 on February 1, 2021)

Introduction and First Reading of Ordinance to Add Division 3, "Wireless Facilities in Right-of-Way" to the Pomona City Code Chapter 46, Article IV; Adoption of Resolution to Establish Fees for Wireless Encroachment Permits

It is recommended that the City Council take the following actions:

1) Introduce, waive further and give first reading to the following ordinance:

ORDINANCE NO. 4279 - AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF POMONA, CALIFORNIA, ADDING DIVISION 3, "WIRELESS FACILITIES IN RIGHT-OF-WAY" TO CHAPTER 46 (STREETS, SIDEWALKS AND OTHER PUBLIC PLACES), ARTICLE IV (ENCROACHMENTS) OF THE POMONA CITY CODE

2) Adopt the following resolution:

RESOLUTION NO. 2021-01 - A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF POMONA, CALIFORNIA, ESTABLISHING A FEE SCHEDULE FOR WIRLESS ENCROACHMENT PERMITS AND TO INSTALL WIRELESS FACILITIES IN THE PUBLIC RIGHT-OF-WAY UNDER CITY MUNICIPAL CODE CHAPTER 46, ARTICLE IV, DIVISION 3 "WIRELESS FACILITIES IN PUBLIC RIGHT-OF-WAY"

Public Works Director Rene Guerrero gave the staff presentation. Gail Karish, telecommunications attorney from Best Best & Krieger, was available to answer questions. Councilmembers asked questions and commented on this item.

MOTION BY COUNCILMEMBER LUSTRO, SECOND BY COUNCILMEMBER ONTIVEROS-COLE, CARRIED 6-1 (COUNCILMEMBER ONTIVEROS-COLE OPPOSED), to introduce on first reading Ordinance No. 4279 and adopt Resolution No. 2021-01.

2. (Discussion Calendar Item No. 18 on February 1, 2021)

Award of Landscaping Contracts to MCE Corporation and Merchants Landscape Services, Inc.

It is recommended that the City Council review the following and choose the appropriate action in each recommendation:

# **RECOMMENDATION NO. 1**

 Approve a three-year contract, with two optional one-year extensions to MCE Corporation to provide Citywide Non-Occupied Median, Street side/Right-of-Way (ROW), and other Landscaping and Amenity Maintenance;

OR

2) Direct Staff to reject the current bids for Citywide Non-Occupied Median, Street side/ROW, and other Landscaping and Amenity Maintenance and issue another Request for bids, and extend the current Citywide Landscaping contract with MCE for the portion of their contract that addresses Citywide non-occupied medians, street side/ROW, and other landscaping and amenity maintenance an additional four months to facilitate the timing of the bidding process.

#### **RECOMMENDATION NO. 2**

3) Approve a three-year contract, with two optional one-year extensions, to Merchants Landscape Services, Inc. to provide Occupied Space Landscape and Amenity Maintenance; and adopt the following resolution:

RESOLUTION NO. 2021-09 - A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF POMONA, CALIFORNIA, AMENDING THE FY 2020-21 OPERATING BUDGET BY APPROPRIATING A TOTAL OF \$6,576 FROM THE UNIVERSITY CORP ASSESSMENT DISTRICT BUDGET FROM AVAILABLE RESERVES

OR

- 4) Direct Staff to reject the current bids for Citywide Occupied Space Landscape and Amenity Maintenance and issue another Request for bids, and extend the current Citywide Landscaping contract with MCE for the portion of their contract that addresses Citywide occupied space landscaping and amenity maintenance an additional four months to facilitate the timing of the bidding process;
- 5) Reject the bid protest submitted by MCE Corporation as meritless; and

- 6) Provide direction to Staff to further pursue in-house maintenance services; and
- 7) Authorize the City Manager to execute the contracts and any extensions to the contracts on behalf of the City, subject to review by the City Attorney.

Public Works Director Rene Guerrero gave the staff presentation.

#### One email comment for Item 18:

"Pomona City Council Members, As per the Council report write-up, MCE did not submit a bid for the Occupied Space Landscaping and Amenity Maintenance (OSLAM) contract, as we erroneously submitted our bid for that contract to the Non-Occupied Median, Street side/ROW and other Landscaping and Amenity Maintenance (NOMSROLAM) contract. The error was only identified after the OSLAM bid had closed, so we were unable to submit our bid to the proper location. The error was noted three days prior to the NOMSROLAM closing, but Planetbids does not allow a submitted bid to be manipulated until after the bid is closed, nor does it allow two bids to be submitted for the same job. Consequently, we had to replace our erroneously submitted bid in order to guarantee participation, so our OSLAM bid was not seen by staff. Based on the proposed annual contract price for the OSLAM contract, we believe it's in the City's best interest to reject all OSLAM bids and issue another RFB. Our erroneously submitted annual price is significantly less than the apparent winner (slightly less than \$150K annually). MCE will be in virtual attendance of tonight's meeting if you have clarifying questions. Sincerely, Jeff Core, President MCE"

approve a three-year contract, with two optional one-year extensions, to Merchants Landscape Services, Inc. to provide Occupied Space Landscape and Amenity Maintenance and adopt Resolution No. 2021-09; reject the bid protest submitted by MCE Corporation as meritless; provide direction to Staff to further pursue in-house maintenance services; and authorize the City Manager to execute the contracts and any extensions to the contracts on behalf of the City, subject to review by the City Attorney.

Adoption of an Urgency Ordinance Amending Chapter 2 of the Pomona City Code by Adding Provisions to Establish an Independent Redistricting Commission in 2021

It is recommended that the City Council adopt the following urgency ordinance:

URGENCY ORDINANCE NO. 4297 - AN URGENCY ORDINANCE OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF POMONA, CALIFORNIA, ADDING DIVISION 6 TO ARTICLE V (BOARDS AND COMMISSIONS) OF CHAPTER 2 (ADMINISTRATION) OF THE POMONA CITY CODE TO ESTABLISH AN INDEPENDENT REDISTRICTING COMMISSION TO DRAW CITY COUNCIL ELECTORAL DISTRICT BOUNDARIES BASED UPON THE 2020 DECENNIAL CENSUS

Human Resources and Risk Management Director Linda Matthew gave a brief presentation.

#### One email comment for Item 21:

"Dear honorable members of the City Council, I wholeheartedly support this ordinance to form an independent redistricting commission. This follows the best practices of jurisdictions from all over California. It should be noted that if an independent commission is not formed, the Council itself must comply with the FAIR MAPS Act, including scheduling the four meetings where redistricting topics are discussed as fixed time items as stated in State law. Councilmembers have noted the oddity of past council districting's and having an independent commission, in consultation with a qualified demographer, review the lines provides some independence and assurance that these districts are drawn to account for communities of interest, and are not designed to split neighborhoods or protect incumbents. Also, these meetings are going to have extensive public input, which we want, and an independent commission is best suited to listen to people in a neutral manner, without preconceptions based on the commenter's previous political stances. important to get a diverse group of individuals to participate, and I encourage councilmembers to recruit from their neighborhoods and networks. However, we should also discourage them from being puppets of councilmembers and give them the space to operate independently and listen to the community. Please approve this item and get to work recruiting this commission. Sincerely, Hank Fung"

#### Live comments was as follows:

John Clifford spoke in favor of an independent redistricting commission so that the process happens outside of a political realm.
