#### Public Comment

Ana Portillo spoke about the City offering youth dance classes that include jazz, R&B, ballet, and ballet folklorico. Ms. Portillo said she would like to see a family weekend overnight campout at a local park and a youth scavenger hunt.

## **COMMISSIONER COMMUNICATION**

Commission Arias-Pulido said he attended The California Endowment Youth Awards conference in Oakland with Gente Organizada on July 23, 2022. He said he would like to see a presentation on youth pre-arrest/youth diversion program and an update on the Hamilton Park project.

Commissioner Jordan asked for information on street repairs near Martin Luther King, Jr. Park.

Commissioner Camacho asked to discuss the conditions of park restrooms and homelessness.

Vice Chair Portillo requested a Tri-City representative to share information on mental health services for youth.

Commissioner Santhosh asked for Youth Summit information.

### STAFF COMMUNICATION

The Youth Summit will be held on Monday, August 8, 2022 from 8:00 a.m. to 3:00 p.m. connecting youth-serving providers and partners for asset mapping and gaps analysis interactive exercises. The day will include presentations, data sharing, information regarding policies for using City and school district facilities, a video presentation, and youth keynote speakers.

Community Services will be providing a recap of summer programs, activities, and events that staff will be presenting at an upcoming Commission meeting.

The City contracts with the YMCA of Orange County for summer operations for the City's pools. Due to a national lifeguard shortage, they were unable to provide a sufficient number of lifeguards to have the City's pools consistently opened.

There will be City pool improvements and will include a rock-climbing wall and a new diving board at Washington Pool and a new diving board and slide at Ganesha Pool.

This Friday, August 5, 2022, Movies in the Park will be at Westmont Park featuring *Big Hero 6*. The last movie will feature *Luca* at Ganesha Pool on Friday, August 12, 2022.

The City offered a Summer Beautification youth employment program to 16 high school students as Jr. Recreation Leaders for a four-week program beautifying local parks and creating their own service projects. Projects included a beach cleanup, installing trashcans, and planting succulents. They participated at National Night Out and provided resources on composting to the community. This evening, Jr. Rec Leaders will be presenting to their family, the projects they completed.

City staff submitted a Youth Community Access grant application through Proposition 64. Staff will be providing information on an upcoming grant opportunity through Measure A's Recreation Access Program at the following meeting.

Mr. Osoff stated that Commissioner attendance and arriving on time is important, out of respect

for fellow Commissioners and the community and to provide their input on City events and functions.
