


DISTRICT 5 AREA COMMANDER MEETING

PUBLIC WORKS

GAREY AVENUE & I-10 EASTBOUND OFF-RAMP TRAFFIC SIGNAL 🚦

This report is a quick update on the Garey Avenue Rehabilitation Project and the new traffic signal at the Garey Avenue and I-10 EB Off-Ramp intersection. Electrical power has been provided by SCE to the intersection for the new traffic signal location. The next phase is the receipt of the traffic signal equipment and Caltrans approval before installation. Once construction is complete, operation and maintenance of the signal will be handed over to Caltrans. Estimated completion for the Project is Winter 2026.



INSTALLATION OF SOLAR STOP SIGNS

To improve visibility and safety in school zones and residential neighborhoods, the Public Works Department has installed four solar-powered LED flashing “stop” signs at Arroyo Avenue and Dudley Street.



The newly installed signs will increase driver awareness by drawing attention to areas where pedestrian activity is high. The flashing signs are especially effective in school zones, high-collision intersections, and locations with limited visibility. By using solar-powered technology, the devices provide an energy-efficient and reliable safety solution.

GANESHA STREET IMPROVEMENT AND WALKING TRAIL/STEPS REHABILITATION PROJECT

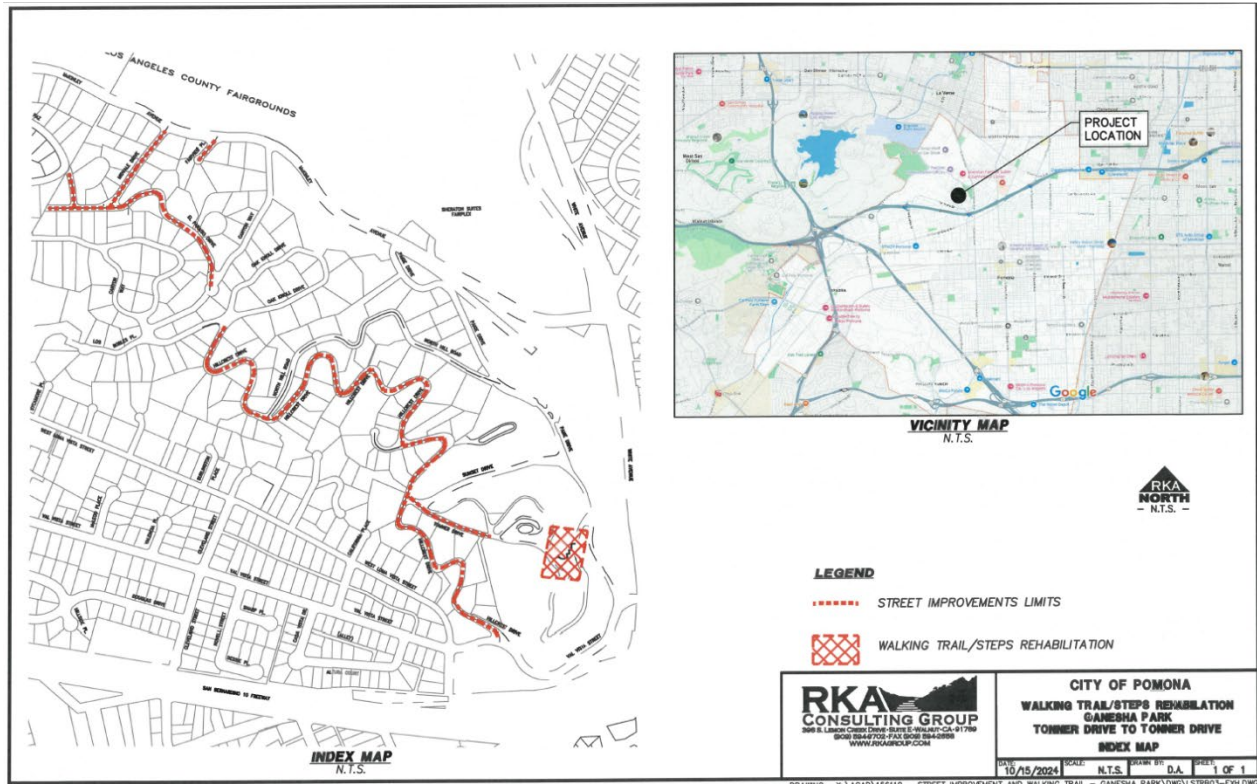
The Ganesha Rehabilitation Project continues! The street paving work is nearly complete, with final punch-list items wrapping up early next month.

This exciting improvement was made possible through the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) Community Project Funding Program, with

\$3,000,000 secured by Congresswoman Norma Torres to help create safer streets and expand opportunities for outdoor recreation in our community.



POMONA ACTS: CITY TREE PLANTING PROJECT IS UNDERWAY 🌳

The City of Pomona and The Energy Coalition have partnered on a groundbreaking initiative backed by a \$22M Transformative Climate Communities (TCC) Implementation grant to connect residents to transportation, reduce emissions, improve public health, and boost economic opportunities.

One of the projects currently underway through this grant opportunity is the City's Tree Planting Project. This initiative includes the planting of 1,000 new street trees throughout the City. To date, approximately 150 of the proposed 1,000 new streets and community trees have been planted. We are making great progress!

If your street is located within the pre-designated project area, highlighted in green on the map below, a door hanger will be placed at your residence notifying you that your street has been selected for tree planting. Planting efforts will be carried out with the support of West Coast Arborists (WCA).

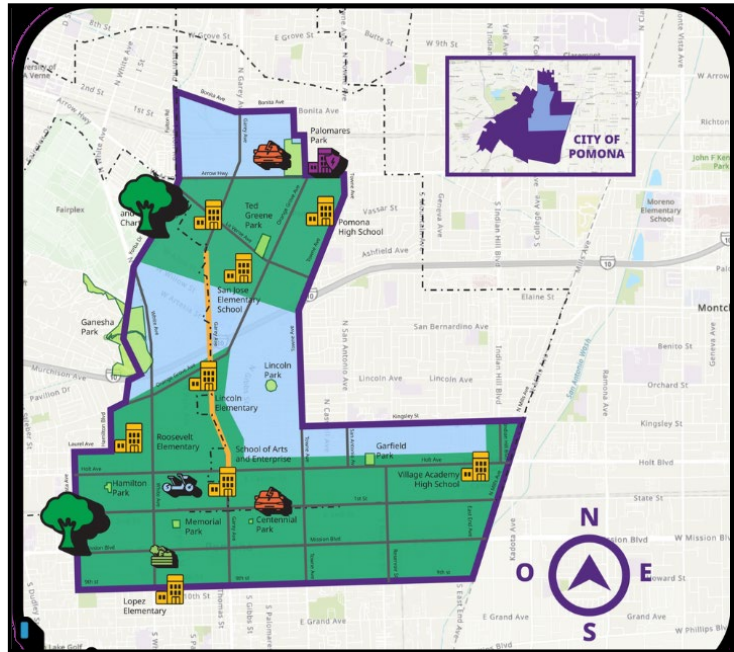
- Once installed, the newly planted trees will be added to the city tree maintenance schedule and will receive trimming and maintenance by the City.
- The watering of the trees, for up to 18 months, will be completed through grant funding support by our partner, San Gabriel Valley Conservation Corps (SGVCC), utilizing local Pomona workforce development participants to support long-term establishment and tree health.
- We do ask residents who receive a street tree to help water the tree, after 18 months.

Benefits of tree planting for your property and neighborhood include cleaner air and reduced pollution, cooler streets with added shade for pedestrians, reduced stormwater runoff, enhanced neighborhood beauty and community pride, and increased property values for you and your neighbors.

Residents will have the opportunity to opt out of the program. If you receive a flyer and wish to opt out, please contact the City’s Parks Division immediately at (909) 620-2223, Monday through Thursday, from 6:00 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. If you reach the office after hours, please feel free to leave a message.

Please note that requests to opt out must be made prior to the tree being planted.

Are you wondering, “Why isn’t my street on the list?” No worries! If you live within the TCC Grant area, reach out to our Parks team and we will be happy to review your street details to see if we can accommodate your request. Be sure to contact us early before all available trees have been claimed 🌿
