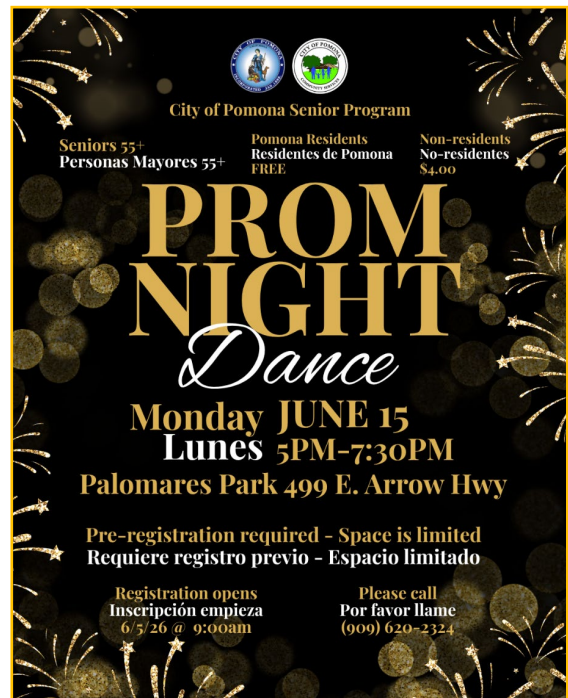
ADULT CO-ED ULIMATE FRISBEE LEAGUE

4. **Sports Adventure:** Campers stay active and try out a new sport each week in a fun and supportive environment.





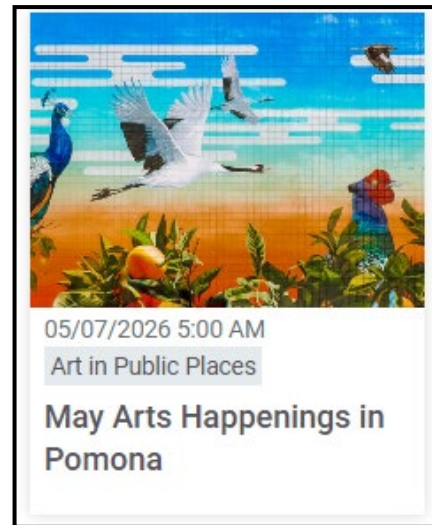

INFORMATION TECHNOLOGY

CYBERSECURITY IMPROVEMENTS

The IT Department is pleased to share the strengthening of employee online access across City Hall and Police departments by fully implementing Multi-Factor Authentication (MFA). When any employee logs in to their online account, they are now required to verify their identity using a second method/step, in addition to their password. Additionally, IT will leverage this ability to further secure our environment by enabling Single Sign On technology for other systems that can integrate with the City's identity management system. This upgrade is part of IT's ongoing commitment to safeguard our digital assets and our infrastructure.

In addition to MFA roll out, IT deployed an automated email security system that works around the clock to detect and respond to suspicious or malicious emails the moment they arrive. When a potential email incident is detected, the system identifies the threat and neutralizes it immediately. The system's real-time response is also complemented with its post-delivery capabilities for continuous remediation should the threat landscape change after delivery, as malicious emails often do to bypass initial scans. This added layer of protection helps ensure that emails post-delivery are systematically deleted from each recipient's mailbox.

Finally, through diligent remediation efforts over the past several years, IT is proud to report a clean web hygiene report from CISA (Cybersecurity and Infrastructure Security Agency), having remediated over 120 vulnerabilities since first leveraging their service in 2022. These findings were identified through CISA's external asset scans conducted against our infrastructure. Stay tuned for more developments from IT!

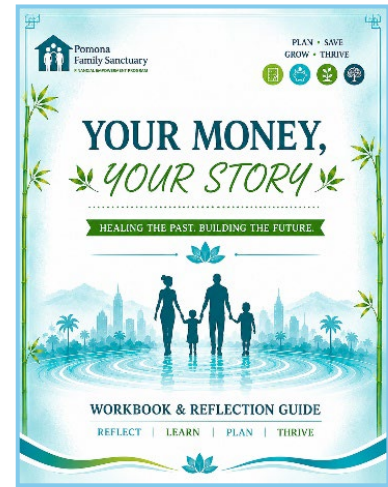

DISTRICT 6 AREA COMMANDER MEETING

PUBLIC WORKS

KIDS WORLD PARK and CIVIC CENTER PLAZA IMPROVEMENTS

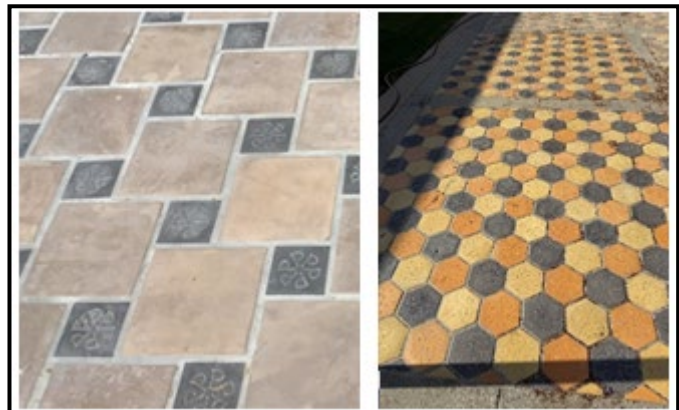
As part of the City of Pomona's Civic Center Plaza Playground Project, grounded in the City's Human-Centered Design (HCD) efforts, new wayfinding signage and parking lot improvements are being developed for *Kids World Park* and the Civic Center Plaza.

These improvements were developed with consideration for Kids World, City Hall, Library and the nearby County Courthouse. Our goal is to keep children and adults safe, improve overall well-being, and make it easier for everyone who visits the Civic Center Plaza. Along with these efforts, portions of 7th Street will be re-paved as well as the easterly portion of the city-county parking lot.



Wayfinding signage is intended, among other things, to reduce traffic on 7th Street between the city-county parking lot and *Kids World Park*. Consequently, vehicular access to/from the county parking lot will be directed to/from Park Avenue.

In addition, “P” tile replacement in various locations throughout the Civic Center Plaza is being completed within available funds. These improvements will make pedestrian travel throughout the area more user-friendly.



This project is planned for completion by late July 2026. We are excited to welcome families back to enjoy this revitalized space and new playground when the project is completed!

SOLID WASTE RATE ADJUSTMENT – CONSUMER PRICE INDEX (CPI)

Due to the unfunded state mandate requiring 75% of organic waste to be diverted from landfills, and other rising costs, solid waste rates will be adjusted. On **July 1, 2026**, the rates for solid waste services will be increased based on the Consumer Price Index (CPI) of 5.00%. The adjustment represents the percent change in the CPI from December 2024 to December 2025.

For a typical single-family residential customer, your rates will increase by \$1.95, resulting in a total of \$40.88 per month.

While we recognize that any rate increase affects household budgets, this adjustment is needed to fund the programs required by the State of California for all cities – including Pomona.
